To our wonderful Supporters,

As I write this, no one could have imagined that the conflict in Ukraine would still be ongoing. More than ever, there is a need to pray for God's intervention. On February 25, 2024, we organized a Global Call to Prayer event for Ukraine, marking the two-year anniversary of the conflict. Thousands in Churches worldwide joined in solidarity, praying for the people of Ukraine. Thank you to all who joined us in prayer that day and continue to keep Ukraine in your prayers.

Over the past two years, we have witnessed the immense challenges faced by families in Ukraine who cannot flee the conflict due to extreme poverty. Reports of children and families traumatised by the harsh realities of war have reinforced the urgency of our mission. Our dedicated team of over 60 staff and hundreds of volunteers continue to work tirelessly on the ground, providing essential aid to those affected by the conflict. Our coordinators in Ukraine are actively providing emotional, spiritual, and material support to those in desperate need.

Your contributions have been crucial in enabling us to assist those living in extreme poverty. In 2023, our Family Sponsorship Program supported 2,692 families, and our Child Sponsorship Program helped 8,026 children. We provided 169,209 warm meals to those in need and distributed 79,308 Bibles, New Testaments, and other Christian books. Furthermore, we delivered 87 truckloads of aid, reaching 44,000 people in communities throughout Eastern Europe.

We have just loaded our second 40-foot container of warm blankets, clothes, school supplies, and hygiene products to be sent to our field countries. We are incredibly grateful to the thousands of Operation Cover Up knitters who have helped make this possible. On behalf of the thousands of vulnerable people living in temperatures as low as -30°C who will be provided with warmth and hope, we want to extend a huge Mission Without Borders thank you.

In October 2023, I had the immense pleasure and privilege of visiting our work in Moldova. Our Moldovan Director, Tudor Langu, shared the story of a Church they partnered with that initially had dwindled to only a handful of people. After a couple of years of our working with them, the Church grew to the point where it had planted four other Churches.

I visited a Church in Lupusna, Moldova, where they were celebrating one year of working with Mission Without Borders. The Church was full of over 300 children involved in our programs, singing and having fun. I wish I could have bottled up that joy to share it with all of our supporters.

We have so many wonderful supporters like you in New Zealand who make all these things possible. From the bottom of my heart, I want to say a huge thank you.

THE INVISIBLE GIRL: TRANSFORMING LIVES BEYOND THE LAUGHTER

When We Publish Pictures From Our Summer Camp, They Always Showcase Happy Faces, Carefree Play, Laughter, And Joy.

These images encapsulate the most beautiful gift we offer children: a childhood as it should be, in the truest sense of the word, or how it should look in an ideal world. Each child, however, carries their own story, often untold and unseen behind the smiles. Today, I want to share one such story—a story without pictures or names—that reveals the profound and meaningful impact of our Summer Camps and the impact you have as a supporter of Mission Without Borders.

A Safe Space For Sharing

This year, we introduced small group discussions at the end of each day's program. These intimate gatherings created a space for the children to share their thoughts and feelings, fostering a sense of community and support. I was privileged to lead a group of girls who bravely shared their burdens with each other. Amidst the tears, encouragement, and hugs, one girl's story stood out.

A Story Of Pain And Resilience

For the past year, she has been a victim of severe peer violence at school. The relentless bullying had driven her to retreat into her home, only stepping out when absolutely necessary. She felt invisible, her identity as a person shattered. This beautiful young girl didn't know how to cope with the cruelty she faced daily. During our sessions, I noticed she would always cry when we sang the song "I Know Your Name." It was clear she felt unseen and unvalued.

Steps Towards Healing

Every day, I reminded her of how wonderful and beautiful she is, and that she is loved just as she is. We discussed the steps she could take to address the bullying, encouraging her to seek help from her school's expertise team. Together, we laid out a plan to help her reclaim her sense of self and stop the ongoing violence.

The True Essence Of Summer Camp

This story, shared by Matea Jevric our Bosnia-Herzegovina Communications Manager, highlights the true essence of our Summer Camps. It's not just about the laughter and fun, but about providing a safe place where children can be seen and heard. It's about giving them the opportunity to shed their invisibility and embrace their worth.

THE LITTLE BOY IN THE BLUE BLAZER: A JOURNEY OF FAITH AND COMPASSION

I want to take you on a journey into a world that profoundly impacted me. In May this year, I visited a small village called Danes, about 1.5 hours outside of Sibiu, Romania.

During my visit, I witnessed a community deeply stricken by poverty. Homes with crumbling facades lined the unpaved and dirty streets. The absence of basic infrastructure like clean water and reliable electricity floored me and deeply burdened me. Yet, amidst these harsh conditions, I saw joy, kindness, and a warm community.

I felt pain, heartbreak, and a burden to share my experience with people like you, and to present the urgent needs of these dire places. The economic hardship and the living conditions these precious people endure filled me with profound sadness and helplessness. However, amidst these challenges, the resilience of the residents was remarkable. They exhibited a strength and sense of community that left a deep impression on me.

Most striking was the children's laughter and joy, which served as a powerful reminder that Jesus is alive and present even in the most difficult circumstances. This visit has forever changed my heart and I called out to Jesus in a deeply burdened way like I have never before.

During my time in Danes, I encountered a little boy in a blue blazer whose eyes reflected a deep well of loneliness and neglect. His small frame seemed burdened by the harsh realities of his life, evident in his eyes. Unlike the other kids, he didn't smile; he couldn't because he hadn't been loved, cared for, or valued. Meeting him was deeply painful for me. I wanted to take him home and give him the love he

deserved. But it also highlighted the urgent need for compassion and support in the lives of vulnerable children like him. This encounter reinforced the importance of the work I'm doing, the work YOU are doing, and the mission we all share in Christ's name.

This little boy will stay etched in my mind forever, reminding me of the work that still needs to be done to create a more loving and compassionate world, as Jesus taught us.

My faith in Jesus guides my mission and strengthens my commitment to making a difference in the lives of those who need it most. It is through His love and teachings that we can bring hope and healing to places like Danes. Let us continue to strive together to fulfil this calling, spreading His light and love wherever we go.

This vital work continues because of the generous support of people who give their hard-earned money, ensuring that children and and their families hear the gospel of Jesus.



A NEW BEGINNING: THE TRANSFORMATIVE POWER OF CHILD SPONSORSHIP

"GIVING MY LIFE TO JESUS WAS THE BEST DECISION I COULD EVER TAKE," SAYS MELISA, A 17-YEAR-OLD WHO GREW UP IN POVERTY. HER FAMILY'S MEAGER INCOME WAS LARGELY CONSUMED BY RENT AND BILLS, FORCING HER FATHER TO SEEK WORK ABROAD. LIFE WAS TOUGH, BUT THINGS CHANGED WHEN MELISA WAS ENROLLED IN MISSION WITHOUT BORDERS' CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM AT AGE 10. THE FAMILY RECEIVED FOOD, CLOTHES, AND SCHOOL SUPPLIES, GIVING MELISA AND HER BROTHER THE CHANCE TO ATTEND SCHOOL AND ENJOY SUMMER CAMP.





Today, both of Melisa's parents are employed, and they own their home. Life remains challenging, but they have come a long way. Despite attending church regularly, Melisa struggled with committing her life to Christ. One day, a visiting preacher's sermon stirred her, but she hesitated. The thought lingered, and when the preacher returned a year later, Melisa knew she had to act. She answered the altar call, leaving behind a past of partying.

In September last year, Melisa was baptized along with ten others, including six connected to MWB. She found joy in Christian Outreach meetings and summer camps, deepening her understanding of God. Initially, she doubted her decision, but with prayer and support from her parents, Melisa now knows it was the right choice.

Melisa's favourite Bible story is David and Goliath, and she aspires to David's faith, courage, and obedience. "I feel so much more relaxed and peaceful now," she says. Melisa actively seeks to grow in her relationship with God, attending church for orchestra practice, prayer, and children's activities, and never missing Sunday services.

Melisa hopes to study paediatric nursing and dreams of traveling to South Korea. She enjoys drawing, dancing, and music, and has even started learning Korean. "I don't want to live in my village after high school," she says. "I want to study in a big city and explore the world."

DESPAIR TO HOPE: FAMILY SPONSORSHIP TRANSFORMS LIVES IN ALBANIA



Kristian was just 15 when his family moved to the barren and desolate Shkodra region in Albania. With no roads, no infrastructure, and no community, they joined other families from remote mountain villages, all hoping to escape a cycle of poverty and despair.

"My father, relatives, and I fought against the unforgiving landscape, breaking rocks to clear land for homes and crops," Kristian, now 36, recounts. "It was backbreaking and dangerous, but it was our only hope for a better life." They built stop banks, filled the land with soil, and managed to cultivate crops and construct makeshift homes.

Despite their tireless efforts, Kristian and his wife Paqsore, who is illiterate due to her remote upbringing, still live in dire poverty with their four children. Kristian takes on any temporary work he can find, while Paqsore stays home, raising their children in a constant struggle to make ends meet.

Their plight caught the attention of Blerina, a compassionate family coordinator for Mission Without Borders. When MWB began its work in the Shkodra region in 2021, they found families like Kristian's who were overwhelmed by loneliness and despair.

"When we first met them, they were barely surviving"

Blerina said. MWB enrolled them in a family sponsorship program, providing monthly food, hygiene items, and regular visits from Blerina for support and love.

Paqsore's mother, who endured severe poverty under the Communist regime, sees a glimmer of hope in her daughter's improved circumstances. "MWB has given my daughter's family a chance for a better life," she said. "They now have a more stable home and healthier food."

Despite her lack of education, Paqsore is determined to give her children a brighter future. "Blerina helped me see the opportunities my children can have if they work hard at school," she said, her voice filled with hope.

Her eldest son Aleks, 12, lovingly helps his younger brother Antonjo, 10, with his reading, while her daughter Angjela, 7, dreams of becoming a chef to provide good food for her family. With the continued support of generous sponsors, these dreams are within reach.



LESYA BIENKO'S VOICE SHAKES AS SHE TELLS HER FAMILY'S STORY. THEY ARE FROM MARIUPOL, UKRAINE, ONCE A LIVELY CITY NOW TURNED TO RUINS BY 80 DAYS OF CONSTANT ATTACKS. LESYA'S STORY IS ONE OF FEAR AND BRAVERY. "WE LIVED IN FEAR EVERY DAY. MY FIVE BOYS SAW THINGS NO ONE SHOULD EVER SEE," SHE SAYS, HER EYES SHOWING THE PAIN OF THOSE MEMORIES.

In February 2022, the war began, and Mariupol was quickly surrounded. Phones stopped working, and Lesya and her husband had no idea what would happen next. "Mariupol became a trap. People trying to escape were attacked," she explains. For two long months, they hid in a basement, hoping for safety. Even stepping outside was dangerous.

"We cooked on a woodfire and used melted snow to wash," Lesya remembers, her voice breaking. They faced the threat of being taken to Russia but managed to escape to a safer area. In the chaos, her husband joined the military, and they lost contact. "When I finally heard his voice, he was relieved to know we were alive. He kept fighting, always worried about us," she shares.

Lesya and her children found a fragile refuge in Sarny, western Ukraine, living in a crowded dormitory. She is now in severe poverty and isolated without her husband, home,

and old life. "We are safer now, but something in us has changed forever. The worry about our future never stops," Lesya confides.

Mission Without Borders has been a huge help to the Bienko family, providing food, hygiene items, and emotional support. "Sergiy and Lyudmyla Soroka from MWB have been amazing. My younger kids have found friends in the teen club and Sunday school they run," Lesya says with gratitude.

MWB's coordinator, Sergiy, talks about their struggles: "Lesya is exhausted, carrying the family on her own. Her hope for her husband's safe return fades as the war goes on." He highlights the many challenges families like the Bienkos face.







A CATASTROPHE UNFOLDS: FAMILIES DISPLACED BY WAR

Sergiy – the MWB staff member who visits Anna's family – said, "We see you; we see the suffering you're enduring, and we want to be around to bring you relief."

Fourteen-year-old Anna was forced to flee her hometown in Eastern Ukraine with her family. Now, they reside in a dilapidated house in Western Ukraine, shared with other displaced families. The house is in dire need of repair, with crumbling plaster, damaged floors, broken windows, and pervasive damp and mold.

As Christmas approaches, the holiday season feels like a distant memory, belonging to another life that seems lost forever.


Anna's former home on the main street of Soledar in the Donetsk region has been destroyed. Soledar, once a strategic salt mining town, now lies in ruins, along with the peaceful life Anna once knew.

Anna's mother, Oksana, recalls, "I remember looking out from the evacuation bus at the place where I grew up and where my children grew up. It was an overwhelmingly heavy feeling of loss and insecurity."

"Nobody believed this war would actually happen," she added. "Even after the first few days, we all hoped it would end soon. But eventually, everyone realized: this is a catastrophe."

"The bombings grew more frequent, and it became dangerous to go outside. The town filled with Ukrainian soldiers and military equipment, preparing to face the Russian armada, which was ten times larger than our army. Many Ukrainian soldiers sacrificed their lives to delay the Russians, giving us a chance to escape."

"First, my children were evacuated," she continued. "They stayed in a temporary shelter, worrying about me and our relatives, especially during periods when there was no mobile phone connection."

"When the Russians approached our area, I packed a few suitcases with clothes and boarded the evacuation bus. At a refugee camp, there was a program for refugee allocation. I went to Sarny with one group, and soon my children joined me. When we reunited, we smiled and cried, and the children clung to me for a long time, finding security in our embrace."

Oksana and her children, Anna, Kyrylo (12), and Oleg (11), now live in Sarny. They share an old house provided for free with two other families from eastern Ukraine. Families like Anna's are extremely vulnerable, facing poverty, trauma, loss, and the challenge of integrating into a new community all at once. To support these families, Mission Without Borders (MWB) provides regular assistance to displaced families in Sarny.

This Christmas, MWB aims to ensure that families like Anna's can celebrate. Despite being far from home and fearful of the future, they find hope in Christ even in the darkest circumstances. MWB distributes thousands of boxes filled with food and treats to families and elderly people living in Ukraine and throughout Eastern Europe. Each box also includes Christian literature explaining the true meaning of Christmas.

Sergiy, an MWB staff member who visits Anna's family, said, "Some might say this is just food, but we know the One who stands behind it. We know His power and Love, and we want to be His hands reaching out to those in need."

For Anna, Oksana, and many others, MWB's Christmas boxes are like a miracle. Simply surviving day to day is an ongoing challenge, and knowing they have enough food for Christmas fills them with hope.

AID DISTRIBUTION

THIS YEAR, WE DISTRIBUTED 1,800 OPERATION CHRISTMAS LOVE FOOD BOXES IN EASTERN UKRAINE AND 8,200 IN WESTERN UKRAINE, PROVIDING ESSENTIAL SUPPLIES TO FAMILIES IN NEED.

CHILDREN'S PROGRAMS

CHURCH PARTNERSHIPS

AS OF 2023, MISSION WITHOUT BORDERS IS COLLABORATING WITH 192 CHURCHES TO EXTEND OUR REACH AND IMPACT ACROSS THE REGION.

Mission Without Border's efforts in providing food, hygiene products, and emotional and spiritual support were lifted up, seeking strength and resources to continue this vital work.
- **4.** Healing from Trauma: Recognizing the deep psychological scars left by war and displacement, participants prayed for healing and resilience. The

emotional and spiritual care offered by Mission Without Border's staff and volunteers was a significant focus, asking for wisdom and compassion to effectively minister to those in need.

5. Strengthening the Mission Without Borders Team: Finally, prayers were extended for MWB's dedicated team of coordinators, volunteers, and partners. Their tireless work on the frontlines of an unprecedented humanitarian crises was acknowledged and uplifted, seeking endurance and encouragement for their invaluable service.

The Global Call to Prayer not only strengthened the bond within the Mission Without Borders community but also served as a reminder of the power of collective faith in Jesus. It was a moment to reflect on the profound impact that dedicated prayer and concerted effort can have in transforming lives and bringing hope to the hopeless.

SURVIVING WINTER ALONE

A WIDOW'S JOURNEY THROUGH POVERTY AND RESILIENCE IN MOLDOVA

In the heart of rural Moldova, where winters are harsh and opportunities scarce, Ecaterina's family grapples with the bitter cold and the heavy burden of poverty. Three years ago, cancer claimed her husband, leaving her alone to care for their three young children in a crumbling house beset by structural issues and the biting Moldovan winter.

Ecaterina, 42, lives day to day, relying on seasonal work in spring and sporadic cleaning jobs in winter to make ends meet. These meagre earnings are no match for the soaring costs of heating and electricity during the coldest months. Her modest home, a single room where the children sleep, doubles as a kitchen and a makeshift laundry room where clothes hang above the stove.

Despite these challenges, Ecaterina is resilient. She recalls how her husband, before his health failed, began repairing their dilapidated home—an effort she continued after his passing. With limited state support, she managed to replace the drafty windows, offering some relief from the biting cold that once seeped through every crack.

The family's lifeline during these bleak winters comes from the Mission Without Borders supporters, who provide essential support. Through MWB's family sponsorship program, they receive warm clothing, firewood, and regular food parcels. Pavel, their dedicated coordinator, visits often, bringing not just supplies but also a sense of companionship that helps alleviate the loneliness Ecaterina feels in her struggle.

For many like Ecaterina, surviving the winter isn't just about

staying warm; it's about maintaining hope amid adversity. Moldova's economic hardships hit single parents and widows particularly hard, with limited job prospects and mounting responsibilities. MWB's assistance is a beacon of hope, bridging the gap between despair and resilience.

Recently, Pavel arrived with winter supplies—a moment of joy for Ecaterina's children, who eagerly donned their new coats and boots. Sebastian, the eldest, proudly declared his intent to wear his new attire to school, a simple pleasure he hadn't experienced in too long. The twins, Alina and Carolina, giggled with excitement, their laughter echoing through the modest home now warmed by Pavel's delivery of briquettes for the stove.

As winter settles in, the family gathers around the crackling fire, finding warmth not only from the briquettes but from the bonds of solidarity forged by MWB's support. Ecaterina reflects on the relief these supplies bring, enabling her to stretch her meagre income further, ensuring her children can attend school and kindergarten without the anxiety of being underprepared.

In Moldova's chilly villages, where poverty often isolates and burdens weigh heavy, organisations like MWB stand as pillars of support, offering tangible proof of care and compassion. As Pavel aptly puts it, "The winter support we provide is a lifeline for families in poverty, showing them, they are not forgotten." Through their efforts, MWB embodies the warmth of community, spreading hope where it's needed most.





FROM ISOLATION & LONELINESS TO COMMUNITY

HOW A SOUP KITCHEN TRANSFORMS LIVES IN BOSNIA-HERZEGOVINA

In Glamoc, a town in southwestern Bosnia-Herzegovina, Mission Without Borders runs a Soup Kitchen that provides daily hot meals to those in deep poverty—mainly the elderly, but also families. Here, God's provision is evident, meeting each person's needs in beautiful ways. Where there was loneliness, He provides fellowship and a new family. Where there was sadness, He brings hope and comfort. Hunger is replaced with a feast, and feelings of isolation are transformed by eyes that see, ears that hear, and hands that embrace.

At the Soup Kitchen, women of different generations support each other despite their own struggles, and men gather to play chess and build community. Those housebound due to health issues find hope in the visits they receive, knowing they are not forgotten.

Thanks to Mission Without Borders' supporters, we can extend

help to vulnerable people when they need it most.

One such person is Stana, an elderly woman who initially was closed off but now sees the Soup Kitchen staff as her family. Blazenko Soldat, the coordinator of the Soup Kitchen, has known Stana for over 20 years. Living alone without family, Stana has found a community that has even saved her life multiple times. Her favorites at the Soup Kitchen are four-year-old Stojana and five-year-old Stojanka, who bring great joy to her and others who view the sisters as their grandchildren.

Stojana and Stojanka come from a large, impoverished family dealing with domestic violence. The Soup Kitchen staff, including Blazenko, have worked with social services to address these issues, and recent reports indicate a positive change. Stana loves the girls' company, and they, in turn, receive much love and attention from her.





The Soup Kitchen is more than a place for a hot meal; it's a community hub. Elderly men like Neđeljko Meselđžija, 86, , enjoy chess games there. He lives alone in modest conditions but also volunteers to deliver meals to those who are housebound, creating a cycle of support and community

I am so very grateful for everything that each one of you do to contribute to the wonderful continuing success of Operation Cover Up. Mother Teresa said "We ourselves feel that we are a drop in the ocean, but the ocean would be less because of that missing drop". How true!

Going back to boats, I am so grateful for the two ships that are taking the bounty of this year's collective effort to Eastern Europe. What a magnificent effort. I have heard of many encouraging stories from all around New Zealand. What we have achieved together is so amazing.

WHAT'S NEEDED FOR 2025

BRAND NEW KNITTED ITEMS

- Jerseys, cardigans, socks, 3-piece sets of hats and gloves (or mittens) and scarfs. Knitwear for children, (however baby's items are not required)
- O Blankets (or sewn quilts) large size only see 'preferred blanket size' information.

BRAND NEW NON-KNITTED ITEMS

- Clothes and shoes for children aged between four to 15 years old.
- Clothes and shoes for adults.
- Hygiene items (soap, flannel, stick deodorant, toothbrush, toothpaste, comb or brush, hair ties).
- O Sports and games equipment e.g. balls for soccer, volleyball, tennis, basketball, inflation pump, baseball set, pole tennis set, hula hoops, frisbees, water guns.
- Sewing machines (new or used in good working order).
 Stationery (exercise books, notebooks, pens, pencils).
 Linen (sheets, pillowcases, duvet covers, towels).
- For the homeless: sleeping bags, warm men's trousers, jackets, jerseys, warm socks, gloves and hats, backpacks, disposable shavers/shaving soap.
- O Sanitary products, small bottles of hand cleansers, disposable razors and blade.

We received an abundance of beautiful blankets and knitted items—truly amazing! However, I need to remind everyone that we only accept new items, not second-hand goods. This year, we received quite a few second-hand items, which takes a lot of time to sort and dispose of, ultimately leading to unnecessary effort and waste.

CRAFTING BEAUTY STITCH BY STITCH

PREFERRED BLANKET SIZE

At least 160cm x 140cm. Seven strips measuring 160cm in length make a blanket. Use size 8 (4mm) needles. Cast on 40 stitches and knitting garter stitch (plain knitting) to 160cm in length. For the homeless, darker colors, heavier wool and even larger sizes are required and blankets must be made of pure wool, not acrylic as it doesn't retain the same warmth. For more information, contact a local coordinator.

FUNDS FOR SHIPPING FREIGHT TO EASTERN EUROPE

We need your help to cover these costs. Each container costs over \$10,000 all up, so as a guide, we ask for a donation of \$5 per blanket. Payments of \$5 or more qualify for a tax rebate receipt (name and address are needed).

BLINI'S (UKRAINIAN CREPES)

Blinis are a delicate Ukrainian crepe that can be enjoyed with a variety of sweet or savoury toppings, making them a versatile and a delicious choice for breakfast or brunch.

Ingredients

- 2 eggs
- 1 cup allpurpose flour
- 1 cup milk
- 1/2 cup sugar (1/4 cup for savoury)
- 2 tsp sunflower oil
- Butter (for brushing)

Directions

- In a blender, combine eggs, flour, milk, and sugar. Blend until smooth. The batter should be runny but slightly thicker than milk.
- 2. Heat a pan and lightly coat with sunflower oil.
- 3. Pour a small amount of batter into the pan and swirl to cover evenly. Use about 1/4 cup of batter for larger pans, less for smaller ones.
- 4. Cook until the edges are golden and the blini lifts easily. Flip and cook for 30 seconds more.
- 5. Transfer to a plate and brush with butter.
- 6. Top your blini with honey, jam, Nutella, or savoury options like cream cheese and smoked salmon for a tasty breakfast or brunch.
